8th Annual General Meeting of Indian Technical Textile Association- FY 2017-18

The 8th Annual General Meeting of ITTA was held on 20th September 2018 at Otters Club, Bandra, Mumbai under the Chairmanship of Shri. Pramod Khosla, Chairman, ITTA. Business session was followed by Knowledge sharing Session wherein three eminent experts from Industry & Government of Chhattisgarh presented different topics of interest to the members.

Knowledge Sharing Session-

Abstract of the three presentations in Knowledge Sharing Session are given below-

"High Performance Fibres used in different segments of Technical Textiles" was presented by Shri. Manoj Jhaver, DuPont India. He explained in detail about the concept of High Performance fibres which covers not only organic but also inorganic fibers of carbon, alumina and boron. High-performance fibers can be classified broadly into three categories according to their applications: Heat-resistant including flame-retardant, High-strength and High-modulus



(HS HM) and Chemical resistance. He highlighted DuPont Product Portfolio from Fibres -- Yarn -- "Sheet" Structures -- Garments and different Protection Solutions i.e. Nomex®, Kevlar® and Tyvek® with their different applications in aircrafts- outside & inside structures, railways, automotive, industrial & nonwoven applications in agriculture.


Dr. Dhaval Patel, Nikol Textile Pvt. Ltd. presented the topic on "Advanced composites made of High Performance Fibres and Indian perspective". He spoke about the definition of composites and different advanced applications of composites such as aerospace, naval, military, automotive, energy/wind turbine and industrial application. Properties of composites - high weight to strength ratio, high stiffness to density ratio, corrosion resistance, low thermal expansion, etc and its uniqueness like Anisotropic Properties, Ability to achieve desired properties in desired directions and Energy dissipation behaviour. Different Fibre type - Carbon- Toray, Teijin, Formusa, Hyosung & Zoltek, Aramid- DuPont, Teijin & Hyosung and



Glass fibre- Owens corning, Binani, Jushi, PPG, Saint-Gobain & CPIC. He said that Indian composite industry will grow from 3.5 lacs metric ton production to 6 lacs metric ton in next two years. Pipe and tank, transportation, wind energy, construction and defence are the major market segments of composites in India. He also highlighted the opportunities & limitations for India i.e. availability of raw materials, Lack of trained manpower, government policies, quality consciousness/

awareness and Industrial representation.

Dr. Kamal Preet Singh, Secretary, Dept. of Commerce & Industries & Shri. P Arun Prasad, MD, Chhattisgarh State Industrial Development Corporation (CSIDC), Govt. of Chhattisgarh presented an interesting topic know as "Discussion on Proposed Incentives for inclusion in Technical Textile Policy, Chhattisgarh". Dr. Singh showed a small video explaining about the different Business advantages in Chhattisgarh. He discussed



about the proposed Incentives for Technical textile policy i.e. (a) Fixed Capital Investment



subsidy (b) Interest Subsidy (c) Electricity Duty Exemption (d) GST Reimbursement (e) Stamp Duty Exemption (f) Land Premium Exemption (in Industrial areas/ Industrial parks) (g) Diversion in Land use (h) Training Assistance (i) Reimbursement of EPF (j) Market Development Assistance (k) Assistance for Acquisition of New Technology (l) PWD Employment Subsidy (m) Technical Patent Subsidy (n) Quality Certification Subsidy. He said that these

incentives will create many opportunities for the new entrepreneurs.

Shri. Amit Agarwal, Hon' Secretary, ITTA proposed a vote of thanks. Shri. Agarwal thanked all the Directors and ITTA members who were present in the AGM. He specially thanked the eminent speakers for making the presentation.
